## Personal Requirements

1. Minimum age requirement: 18 years old. (An official photo ID or birth certificate must be presented at the time of application.)
2. All applicants must have a High School Diploma or GED.
3. Physical Health requirements: An applicant must be able to perform the work of the trade, pass a physical exam and drug test after being offered employment.
4. Educational requirements: One must pass a general aptitude test consisting of reading, mechanical reasoning, spatial relations and basic math (addition, subtraction, division and multiplication of whole numbers, fractions, decimals and percents.)

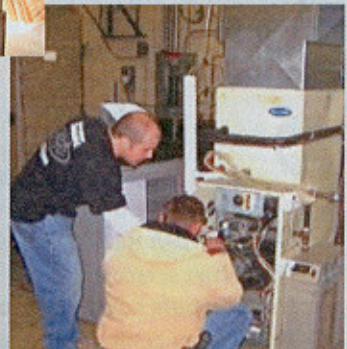
